

A Devotional—Keep going because of what God has done.

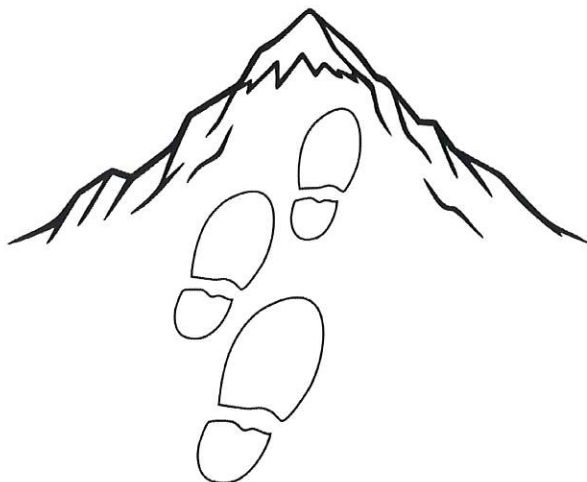
Read: Acts 8:26-40

DAY
1

Brave Steps

God helped Peter and John be brave. God helps you too! When you feel scared or tired, you can keep going. God has done big things for you. He loves you. He made you. He helps you. Remember what God has done. Then take your next step.

ON-PAGE ACTIVITY: Inside each footprint, draw one thing God has done for you.

2

God is Good

Gather your family together. Ask everyone if they would be willing to take a turn telling each other about what God has done for them. They can share about any time they've seen God working in their life!

Talk about your stories and think about someone outside of your family you can share your stories with.

LOOK for people in your life you can tell about what God has done for you.

3

What God Has Done

God made you. God loves you. God sent Jesus to make a way for you to be with God forever! Stop and remember what God has done for you! ASK God to help you share joy with others.

AT-HOME ACTIVITY: Grab a few sticky notes. Draw a heart on one. Draw a smiley face on another. Write your name on another. Place the sticky notes on your bathroom mirror.

ASK God to help you keep going today because God cares about YOU.

4

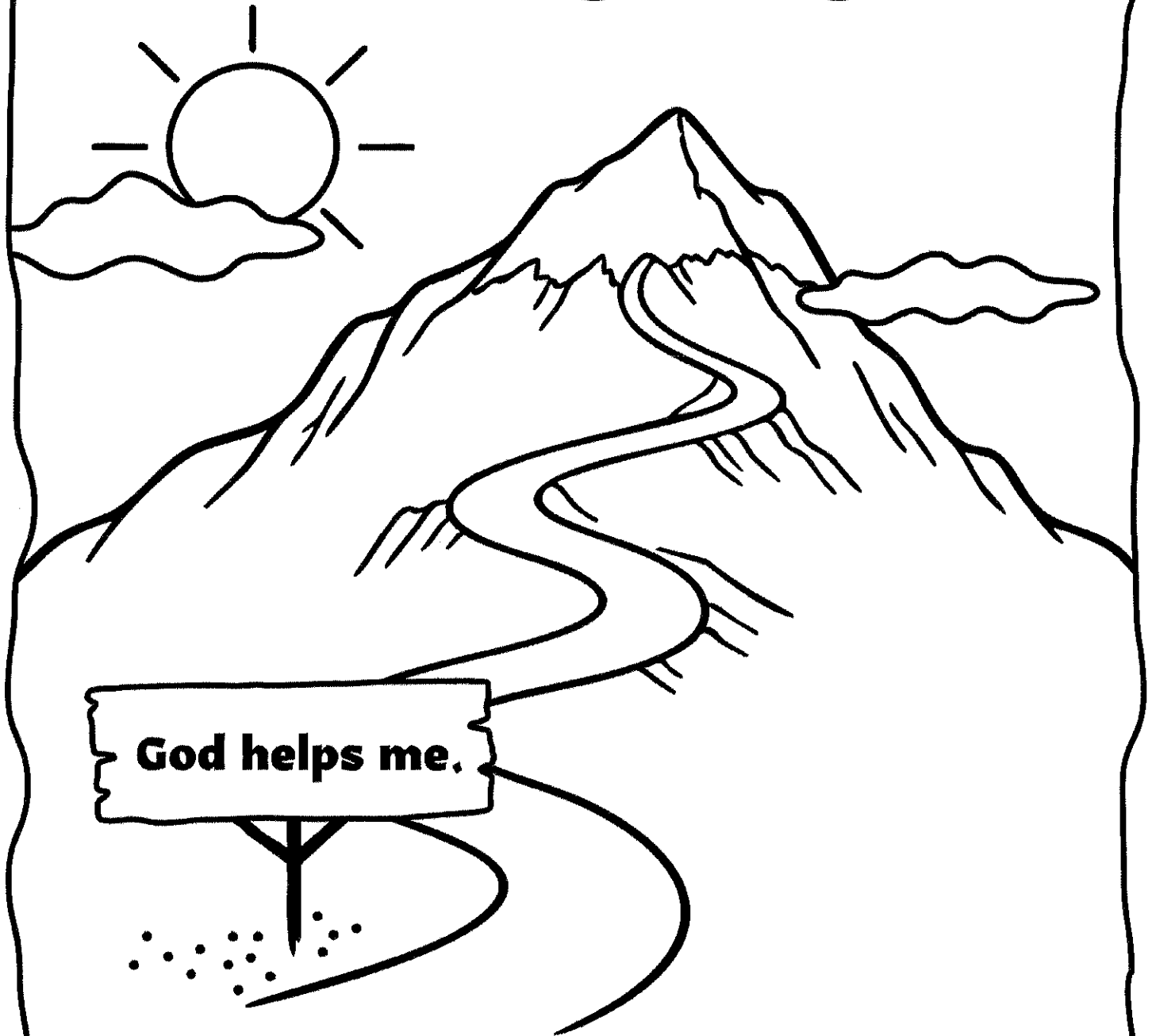
God Gives Courage

God helped Peter and John speak bravely. God can help you too. It can be hard to be brave sometimes. It can be scary to do the right thing when no one else is. When you feel nervous or afraid, God can give you courage. God loves you so much and is always with you.

Prayer: "God, thank You for helping me. Help me keep going when things are hard. Thank You for loving me. In Jesus' Name. Amen."

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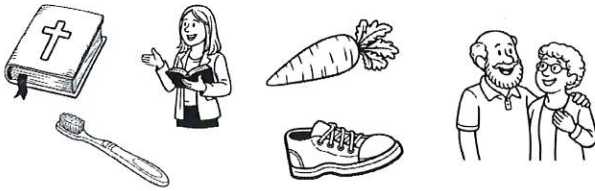
Read: Acts 3–4:22

1

Wonder Questions

Did you know it's great to ask questions? The man from Ethiopia had questions, and God sent Philip to help him. God can send someone to help you when you have questions too. You can ask a grown-up, a teacher, or a leader at church. God loves to help you learn more about Him.

ON-PAGE ACTIVITY: Circle the pictures that help you find answers when you have questions.

2

Practice Listening

Play a game of Simon Says with your family or friends. One person will call out simple instructions, such as “Touch your toes,” and everyone else will follow the instructions—BUT ONLY if the leader says, “Simon Says” before the command.

Practice listening to whoever is leading the game. Listen for what they say and what they don't say. When you listen to who is leading, you're more likely to succeed in the game!

KNOW that listening to God's Word will help you know how to live.

3

Ask for Help

You can talk to God anytime, anywhere, and about anything! God always, always hears you. That means when you have a question, you can stop and ask, “God, can You help me find an answer?” He can send someone to help you understand. So keep asking God questions! Then stop to listen and look to see how God might answer your question!

AT-HOME ACTIVITY: With a grown-up, write down some questions you have about God. Talk about one question you have. Pray together.

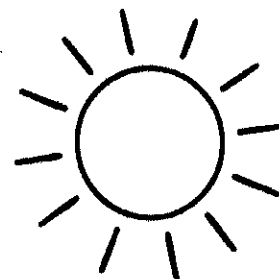
Thank You for Helpers

God has put people in your life to help you. Can you name some people who help you? God put people in our community, like firefighters, nurses, and crossing guards. These people help keep us safe. God also gives you people to help you when you have questions about your faith—people like your small group leader, your parent, and your pastor. You can thank God for loving you and giving you people to help you!

Prayer: “God, thank You for giving me people to help me! I love You, God. In Jesus' name. Amen.”

1

New Eyes

God helped Paul see the truth. God can help you see the truth too. Sometimes you think something is one way. Then God shows you a new way to see. When you listen to God, He can change your heart. He helps you learn what is right and good.

ON-PAGE ACTIVITY: Color the eyes to look like your eyes.

A New Way Today

When Saul was arresting followers of Jesus, Jesus ended up appearing to Saul! When Jesus appeared to Saul in a bright light, Jesus spoke to Saul and gave him a HUGE mission.

But after that, Saul ended up not being able to see for three days until God sent someone to help him.

Grab a blindfold and cover your eyes. Have someone help you walk around your house without being able to see.

ASK Jesus to help you see people and things the way He sees them.

God Helps Me Change

Paul changed because God helped him see Jesus. God can help you change too. He can help you see a friend with kindness. He can help you see a mistake as a chance to try again. God helps you grow every day.

KNOW that God can change my heart and help me grow.

4

Change the Way

Jesus helps us see things differently. Because of Him, we can see the world around us like He does. We can see ourselves and others as the people God made—and loves!

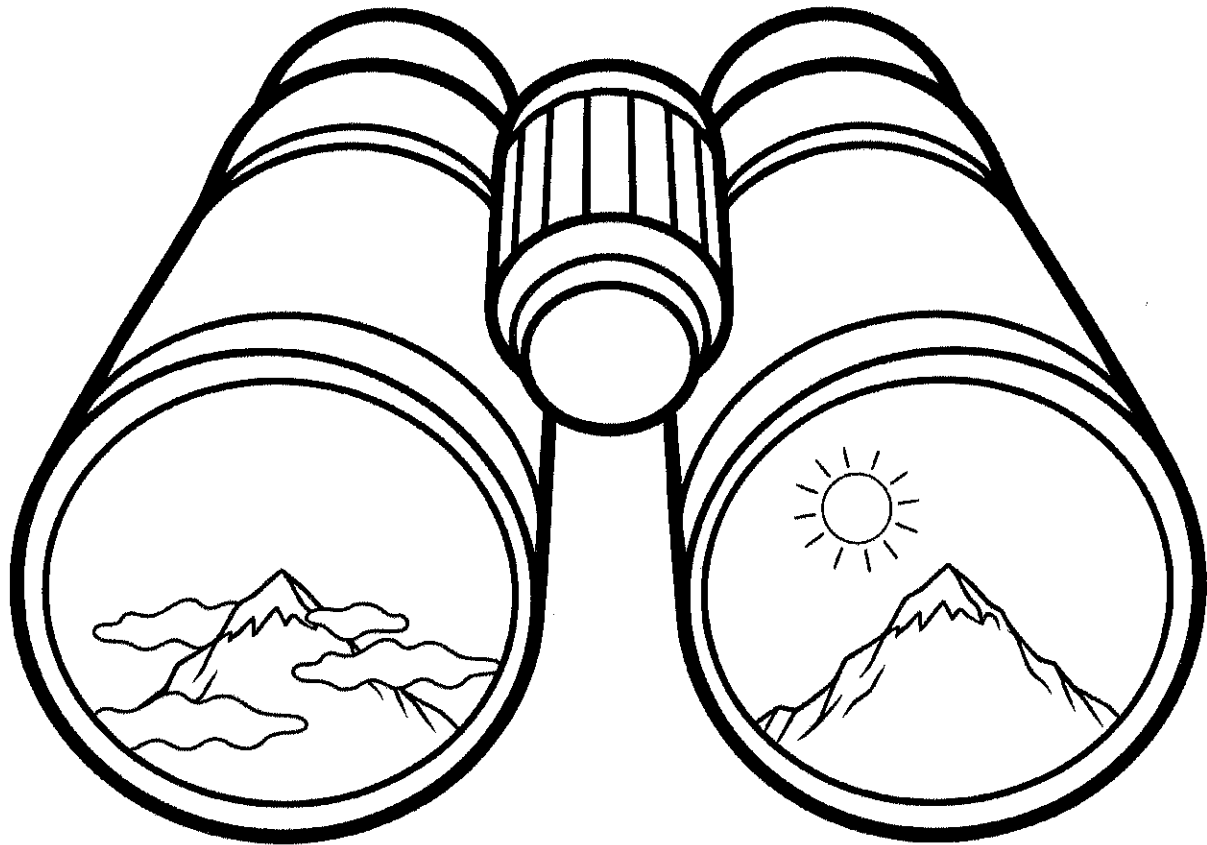
Prayer: “Dear Jesus, thank You that everyone around me is so unique. I pray that I can see others the way You see them and how You created them. I pray that I can love them like You love me. In Jesus’ name. Amen.”

DAY
1

God Holds Me

A storm can feel scary. Bad things can happen. But God is still with you. God is strong. He can help you feel safe. When you feel worried, you can trust Him. He holds you like a strong rope on a mountain.

ON-PAGE ACTIVITY: Draw a boat safe on the waves.



LOOK, God is with me when things feel scary.

DAY
2

Trust in the Storm

Paul trusted God during the storm. You can trust God too. Trust means you believe God loves you and will help you. Even when life feels hard, God does not leave you.

KNOW that God stays with me when bad things happen.



DAY
3

Sink or Float

When something bad happens, you can talk to God. You can say, “Help me!” God is always with you and always hears you. You can keep trusting Him, one step at a time.

AT-HOME ACTIVITY: With a grown-up, gather a few small items and a large bowl of water. Place the items one at a time in the bowl to see if they sink or float. Remember that God always helps us to stay afloat.

ASK God to help you trust Him when bad things happen.

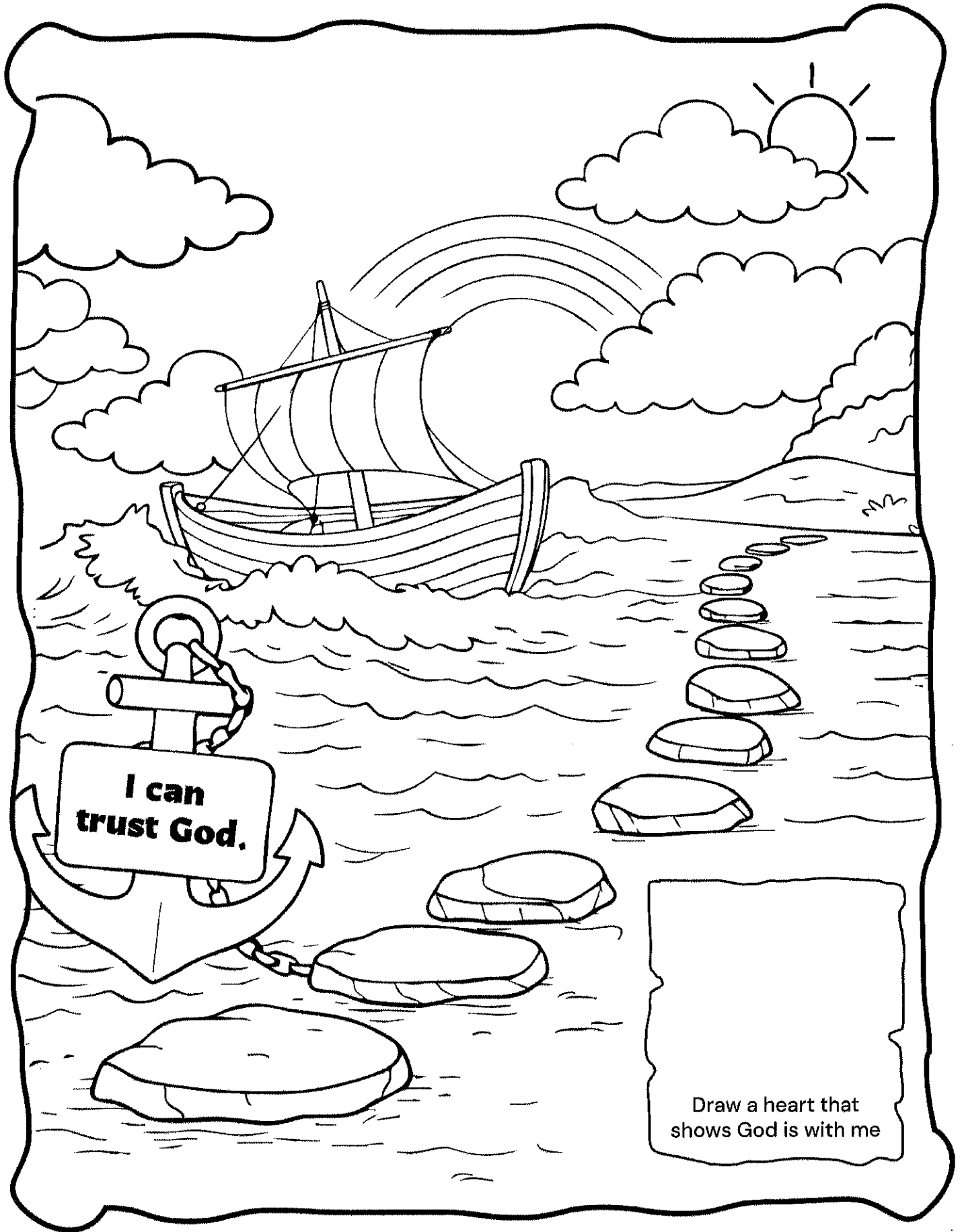

Thank You, God

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Revelation 21:3–5

1

Best Ending

God promises a happy ending someday. Heaven is a place where we can be with God forever. There will be no more sadness or pain. When you feel sad or hurt, you can remember God's promise: God will make everything right in the end.

ON-PAGE ACTIVITY: Use markers or crayons and make this frown into something new!

DAY
2

God Makes It New

God says He will make everything new. That means heaven will be full of joy and peace. God will fix what is broken. You can trust God's promise. Even when life is hard, God will make everything right in the end.

KNOW that God will make everything new and right.



DAY
3

Hope on the Trail

God loves you so much. God sent Jesus to make a way for us to be with Him forever. When we choose to follow Jesus, we will live forever in heaven with God one day.

AT-HOME ACTIVITY: With a grown-up, get a clear plastic cup or jar and a battery tea light. With an adult, place the light inside. Write "God will make everything right" on a paper and tape it to the outside. Place this by your bed at night.

ASK God to help me remember His promise of heaven.

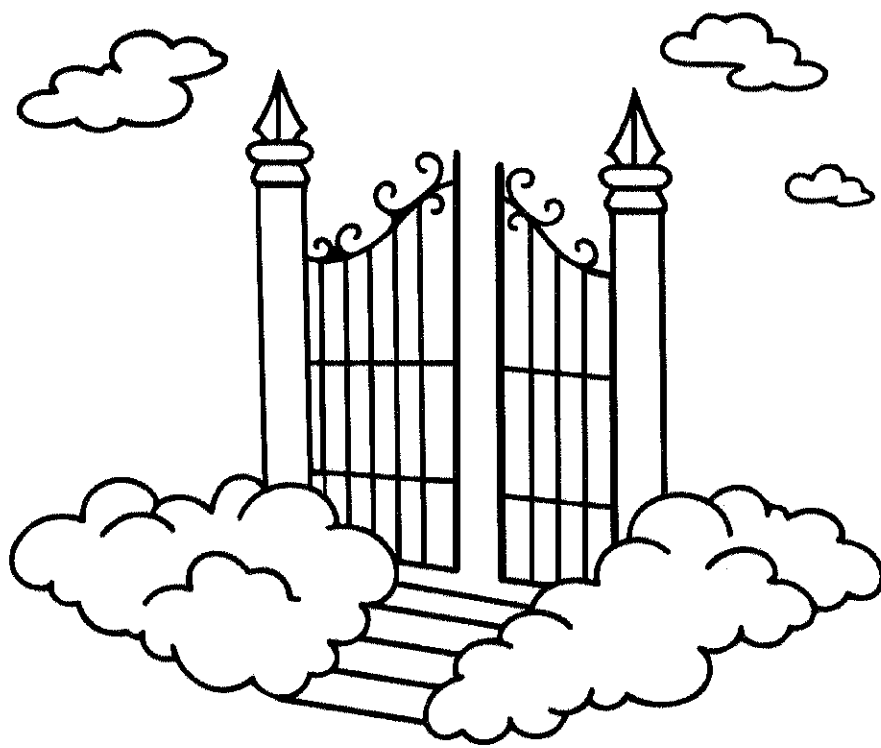
DAY

Thank You for Heaven

Turn off the lights and turn on a flashlight or a nightlight. Then, pray for someone who is hurting. Thank God for heaven and His promise to make everything new and right.

Prayer: "God, thank You for heaven. Thank You that You will make everything right. Help me have hope in Your promise! I love You, God. In Jesus' name. Amen."
